## BIRDING IN MONTA LOMA

## The Mourning Dove

Ground feeders, birds that feed primarily on the ground, are plentiful in our Monta Loma Neighborhood. Look for them foraging for spilled seed underneath your seed feeder. Most common are the mourning doves, named for their mournful call, "who, whooo, whoo." Close relative of the Rock Pigeon (our common pigeon) the 10 1/2" long Mourning Dove's fat body is beige with darker wings, which make a startling sound when the Mourning Dove takes flight. Its small head is a pinkish beige/gray color. You might notice one or two short, black lines on its cheek. Its long, pointed tail has white-tipped outer feathers. Its bare legs and feet are pink. Unlike most birds, which swallow water by lifting their heads, all doves and pigeons suck water. Plentiful across the U.S. and southern Canada, Mourning Doves have adapted





well to living near humans, and are increasing in numbers. In 31 states, they are considered a game bird, and 30 million are taken every year! Once attracted to your yard, Mourning Doves will often nest in hanging planters, in plain view, beginning in February/March.

**Innovative Play Zones:** Thoughtfully designed areas that foster physical, cognitive, and imaginative play for people of all abilities.

**Barbara Butler Treehouse:** Two-story fully wheelchair accessible space for imagination, fun and stage performances

**Kindness Corner:** A dedicated space promoting connection, kindness, and social inclusion.

**Unique Equipment:** Features like high-back swings, spinning zones, and tactile play elements, as well as ramps that accommodate mobility devices.

**Quiet Spaces:** Custom Hideaway Huts for individuals who need a sensory break during play.

Yum! Our Used Book Sale was a big success! Students stocked up on awesome reads for their February break.




Thank you to everyone who donated and helped spark a love of reading.
